Special educational needs (SEN) refers to children and young adults who have learning difficulties or differing abilities that make it harder for them to learn than most children of the same age. Many children (c.20% +/-) will have some form of additional learning requirement during their education – whilst others may require continued support throughout their time in school.

Our locally delivered course will equip learners with the knowledge, skills and understanding to engage constructively and confidently with children and young adults with special educational needs and additional learning requirements.

The course comprises:

ALL learners need to complete our introductory **‘Speech Language and Communication needs in Children’ (SLCN-C)** – (60 general credits) course. This is an intensive six-month programme and will involve 40 hours face-to-face teaching or workshops with additional time required for reading, assignments and meeting with tutors. Successful completion of this course will enable learners to receive a post-graduate certificate. This course is accessible to professionals in fulltime work.

Thereafter learners need to choose between a) **‘Specific Learning and Language Difficulties’ (SpLLD)** – (30 general credits) **or**, b) **‘Autistic Spectrum Disorders and Social Communication Impairments’ (ASD/SCI)** – (30 general credits) – both courses will require 30 hours of face-to-face lectures/workshops and learners will be required to undertake additional study in order to complete extended reading, assignments and tutorials.

NB: Learners who have successfully completed the introductory course and one of the above will be entitled to receive a post-graduate Diploma.

The 90 credits derived from the above training can then be transferred to Anglia Ruskin University to gain an MA in Special Educational Needs and Disability at London Learning Centre. To achieve this, learners will need to take two further modules. These are:

Educational and Social Research Methodology (MOD001526) – 30 Masters credits

In this module, you are taught key theory and practice behind educational research. You will engage with a variety of research methods and methodologies and learn how to apply them in an educational setting.

Postgraduate Major Project (MOD001383) – 60 Masters credits

This is a Masters level dissertation. You will have the option of either a literature-based project or a small field research project. You will work with support of a supervisor, but most of the work will be self-managed.
